### New Construction, Remodel, or Addition

Over 150,000 square feet	\$4,662.50 plus .09/sq. ft. over 150,001 sq. ft.

### Automatic Fire Suppression Systems for Commercial Cooking Operations

### Flammable or Combustible Liquid Storage Tanks

### Fire Apparatus Access Automated Gates

Information review and inspection fee for installation of automatic security gates across fire apparatus access roads	\$100.00 per gate

### Re-inspection Fee

Re-Inspection Fee	\$100.00/inspection
Note: This inspection fee shall be assessed for each re-inspection when: 1) an inspection is scheduled and the contractor is unable to complete the inspection when the inspector arrives 2) when corrections called out on a previous inspection are not made or 3) when the contractor does not have the permit card or plans available for the inspector within a reasonable amount of time.	

### Additional Information Reviews

### Operational Permits

Public and Private Assembly Inspection (Standby)	\$48.00 per hour, per inspector

**Governmental Agency Exemption:** The governments of the City of Brighton, Colorado and the City of Commerce City, Colorado (collectively, the “Government”), shall be exempt from the payment of fees for inspection-related services performed in connection with buildings, structures or real property owned or operated by the Government, and used for governmental purposes.

**Related Fees:** The payment of the fee for construction, uses, processes, or operations authorized by an operational permit or construction permit shall not relieve the applicant or holder of the permit from the payment of other fees that are prescribed by law or required by this FeeSchedule.

**Fee Refunds:** The fire code official is authorized to establish a feerefund policy.

**Outside Consultant:** Plan and/or information reviews may be sent to an outside consultant retained by the District for this purpose. The applicant shall be required to pay the direct costs of the consultant’s services plus a \$48 administrative handling fee to the District.

## Emergency Alarm Inspections

An Emergency Alarm Inspection Fee shall be charged for all Category II fire alarms, as defined below.  
 EXCEPTION: When waived, for cause, by the fire code official.

### Definitions

For the purpose of this Fee Schedule, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

**CATEGORY I ALARMS:** An alarm requiring a fire department response where the system operated properly and a fire department inspection reveals the alarm was caused by a malicious or mischievous action; a guest; circumstances beyond the control of the owner, occupant, or lessee; or by an actual smoke or fire condition.

**CATEGORY II ALARMS:** An alarm requiring a fire district response where a fire department inspection reveals the alarm was caused by a system malfunction, by a user error, or by an undetermined cause.

**SYSTEM MALFUNCTION:** An alarm which a fire district inspection reveals was caused by: (1) poor or improper maintenance; (2) improper installation of alarm equipment, hardware, or wiring; or, (3) improper action of the alarm monitoring center or fire alarm installation/testing company.

**UNDETERMINED CAUSE:** Any alarm for which a fire district inspection does not reveal the apparent cause.

**USER ERROR:** The intentional or negligent act or omission of an agent, employee, contractor, or representative of the owner, occupant, or lessee.

### Emergency Alarm Inspection Fee Schedule

CATEGORY I Alarms	A fee shall NOT be assessed
CATEGORY II Alarms	The owner, or a representative of the owner, of a fire alarm system transmitting a Category II alarm shall be assessed a fee in accordance with Fee Schedule Table 2. There is no limit on the amount of Category II alarm fees that may be assessed in a calendar year or calendar quarter. Where multiple buildings are protected by a single system, the number of Category II alarms caused by system malfunction shall be counted separately for each building, if the location of the malfunction can be ascertained. EXCEPTION: Category II alarms transmitted in the first 30 calendar days after the fire district accepts a new system for service shall not be included in the number of alarms.

**Rebate eligibility:** The fire district may rebate one-half of an Emergency Alarm Inspection Fee if, within 30 calendar days of the alarm, the owner, occupant, or lessee submits to the fire district written documentation, acceptable to the fire district, establishing that necessary repairs or corrections have been made to the system by a qualified agent.
